



## THREE-PERSON OFFICIATING

The KHSAA again reminds member schools that there is no requirement or mandate to use three officials at any time for basketball games during the regular season. However, three officials will be used in boys' and girls' district, regional and state tournament competitions.

In addition, in accordance with the KHSAA Handbook, the district game fee for each of three officials is \$40 per game. Regional tournament officiating fees are \$45 per official. Twenty cents per round trip mile is allowed for one car per game with no hook-up mileage allowed. Assigning secretaries (and not game officials) will be providing tournament managers with specific game fee/mileage fee information for tournament assigned officials.
