

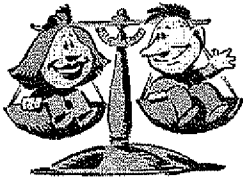

5. Flag pole added to field

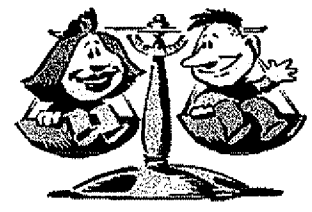
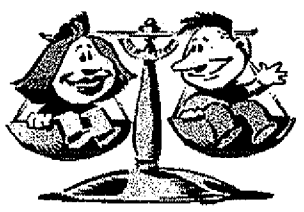
