- III. Awards: Cross Country, and Football spent money on special awards not provided by Athletic Department. They were warned not to do this in the future. Baseball bought rings as rewards for a successful 2001 season without permission. They were fined an equal amount by the Athletic Department and this was spent on girls' equipment.
- IV. Publications: The Athletic Department produced a program for each sports season and each team and participant was included in the program.


