Corrective Action Plan 2000-2001

<u>First concern</u> was in the equity of local media coverage. The local media was contacted by the committee and discussed how this concern could be solved. The local media stated that their coverage depended on the sale of ads to support their broadcast. Booster club members agreed to help sell the ads in order to help support the broadcasting of their sport.

Second concern was that all softball and baseball fields in the Christian County School System have lighted fields except the baseball field at Hopkinsville High School. All lights were purchased by the Christian County Board of Education. Softball parents and committee members attended a board meeting to discuss this inequity. The board agreed that this needed to be corrected, however because of the short fall in funds for the 2002-03 school year the purchase of lights would be delayed for another year. The committee will have to continue to monitor this inequity for the coming 2002-03 school year.
