Discussed the status of former corrective action plans; the training room and weight room committees were proceeding and will be finished by the end of the school year.

Discussed possibilities for the corrective action plan for the 2002-2003 school year:

- <u>Charter bus for out of state trips</u> Entire committee agreed on the need but did <u>not</u> think it a Title Nine issues due to both boys and girls need the service.
- Food Money for students after away sports trip. After games some students have food money and some do not – needs to be corrected. The school provides meals for out of state trips but <u>not</u> for in state away games. Several options were discussed but all thought this need was not a Title Nine issue.
- 3. <u>Equal access to signing for all teams</u>. Committee thought this was important for the Athletic Director to enforce but not a Title Nine issue.
- 4. Equal girls and boys Middle school basketball tournament against other schools for the deaf. All agreed that this was not equal and needed to be corrected.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event.
