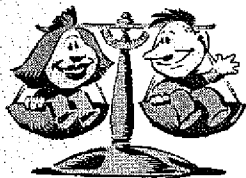

He went on to explain that he was compiling data from all athletic programs to complete the 2001/2002 audit. He cautioned all members to expect an official audit from the the KHSAA office sometime next fall.

Mr. Miller reported that our fall sports programs were in compliance with Title IX as far as opportunities were concerned. He further stated that he was in the process of compiling data from winter sports.

Mr. Miller advised the members present that the KHSAA was auditing approximately 20% of member schools for Title IX compliance each year and in all likelihood MCHS could expect to be audited in the fall of 2002. For the most part he felt confident that we would be in compliance when audited. His only concern was in the area of budget documentation and booster club expenditures.

Motion was made , seconded , and approved to table budget and booster club concerns until the spring meeting so that more committee members might be present to voice their opinions.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (**do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads**). Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.


