D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments:
		It is recommended that school personnel generate a uniform replacement rotation plan and place it in the permanent Title IX File. In addition, travel opportunities should increase for girls' sports and the number of competitions for volleyball and softball should increase. Travel funds should include more equitable distribution for meals. The provision of practice uniforms and practice game shoes should be provided for some female participants. Due to workload realities, it is recommended that the school employ an additional head coach for either basketball or volleyball. School personnel should continue to monitor the percentage of funds being distributed to each gender in comparison to number of participants.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).

 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
