In response to last year's survey which indicated an interest in track and cross country, we have implemented both a boys and girls cross-country team for the fall and a boys and girls track team for the spring season. We also advertised positions for a tennis coach since there was some interest and we already have one tennis court on campus. However, the one person who expressed interest in the position later declined when the SBDM offered him the job. Therefore, with no coach and the season approaching we were unable to offer the sport. We are presently talking with interested parties concerning the addition of soccer. Presently there is only one school in our area that is planning on offering this sport and again we lack the facilities or the land for expansion of facilities. We will continually look into the feasibility of adding these and any other sports that our annual survey indicates a significant interest exists.

2. Item #7 - Softball facility on Campus

A softball facility on campus remains as a major concern for the Gender Equity Committee and the SBDM Council. We presently do not have the land needed to have a softball field on campus. We are in the process of trying to acquire the land from the Kentucky Highway Department and to request the land to be filled when US 119 is constructed. We have had several meetings with their officials and state legislatures in hopes of securing this land and the fill for a softball field on campus. We are still awaiting their final decision.

We requested in writing to Superintendent Welch and the Pike County Board of Education to assist us with completing storage facilities and assisting with securing locker rooms and restroom facilities for the softball team at Mullins Elementary where the field is currently located. With the onset of the season approaching we are hoping this matter will be resolved.

3. KHSAA Follow-UP

Prime Time Contests/Girls' Basketball

We have examined the number of prime time games for both girls and boys basketball and have strived to make an increase since our audit in 2000. We have been able to increase the equity each year. As contracts are renewed, scheduling of games on the same nights, during prime time and during the week will be adjusted to ensure equality between the girls and boys varsity basketball teams. (Percentages of prime time games played are hereto attached.)

Volleyball Storage Facilities

As evidenced in the self-study there was a need identified for a locked storage area for volleyball. We have identified an area that could be used for this need. We have requested from the maintenance department of the Pike County Board of Education the fabricating of a caged area that is lockable and secure. However, this request to date has not been granted and we will submit another maintenance request.
