Russell High School Russell Independent Schools Cheerleading Program 2002

The Varsity Cheerleading Squad will consist of up to 30 members. Students eligible to cheer on this squad will be in grades 9-12. Requirements for Varsity consist of a standing back handspring and a back handspring series (3). The back handspring series may be waived if the participant scores exceptionally high in all other areas of their score sheet, or meet requirements for stunt purposes. This will be solely at the discretion of the coach/sponsor. However, if the series requirement is waived, the participant will have a probation period of 3 months to meet that requirement. Penalty for non-compliance will be removal from the squad or coach/sponsors discretion. All squad members are required to take a team tumbling class as assigned by the coach/sponsor.

Any past member of the Russell High School Cheerleading squad that was either removed from the squad or resigned from the squad will not be allowed to tryout the following year.

Any cheerleader who will be a senior and has cheered three consecutive years for Russell High School will have a separate tryout with emphasis on attitude, dependability, reliability, leadership qualities and tumbling requirements. There are no guaranteed spots on this squad.

The entire squad will be responsible for cheering at the Varsity Football games. The squad will be split into 2 equal squads for all Girl's and Boy's Varsity basketball games unless the total number of squad members is less than 20. All basketball games will be cheered on an equal rotation basis. If the squad is split into 2 separate squads for basketball season, squad 1 will cheer a girl's game on Monday and a boy's game on Friday and squad 2 will cheer for the boy's on Tuesday and the girl's on Thursday then switch days for the next weeks games. Game selection and rotation will be at the discretion of the sponsor. The sponsor may assign other events as they arise. A competition squad will be selected from within the group, depending on ability and need, and will be at the sole discretion of the coach/sponsor. The competition squad will compete in three events per year. Practice times will vary outside of regularly scheduled practices for games.

The Varsity sponsor will set the tryout dates, and in collaboration with additional outside judges, will conduct tryouts. There will be a one-day tryout clinic conducted by UCA that all participants will be required to attend. They will learn the material that will be used for their tryout. Clinics will begin on the following Monday through Thursday where each participant will have ample time to work on their tryout material. Their actual tryout day will be on Friday. Participants will be chosen based on their performance during the clinics as well as the actual tryout. Participants must be present for the entire clinic week in order to be eligible unless there are extenuating circumstances and arrangements are made with the sponsor in advance. The clinic will be closed to all but the participants. Sign up sheets will be in the front office. You must sign up in advance.

Results will be posted 2 hours after tryouts are over. Score sheets will be kept on file with the Athletic Director but may be accessed only by administration and cheer sponsors.

These cheerleading guidelines for Russell High School will be in effect beginning March 15, 2002 and may be reviewed and edited in March 2003. A copy of these guidelines will be on file in the athletic directors office as well as with the sponsor in charge.
