

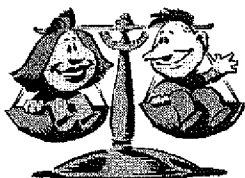

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Corrective Action Plan for 2002-2003

On January 30, 2002, the KHSAA Audit Committee issued their Title IX Audit of Scott High School.

The audit was highly complimentary and made only three suggestions. They have been integrated into our corrective action plan listed below.

1. The KHSAA Audit Committee indicated they liked our athletic policies but that some of them not in writing be formalized. This will be done in 2002-2003.
2. The KHSAA Audit indicated that we needed a student representative on our Title IX Committee. We will select one to be available by the first meeting in the Fall of 2002-2003.
3. We will continue our support of girls' prime time play by implementing the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference recommendations for prime time play. This is to be implemented in the 2002-2003 season.
4. We have addressed the publicity issues of cheerleading and pep band as they relate to gender and will continue these policies with the new band director
5. We will continue to seek solutions to our locker room situation. The common hallway is useful but capital outlay is needed to actually separate the genders effectively and provide complete equity.
6. The softball facility project will be completed in 2002-2003 which will have included sprinklers, dugouts, fencing, yellow capping, batting cage, bull pens, and Public address. We have placed backstop fencing on the needs assessment for the Kenton County Schools to address in 2002-2003
7. Although we met the standard of proportionality, we will review our student surveys to determine if the interest, finances, and competition is there to launch any additional sports or sport levels.
