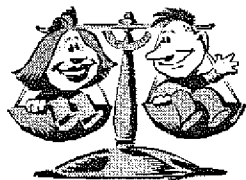



**NOTES REGARDING TITLE IX REPORT FOR SHELBY COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL FOR 2001-2002 SCHOOL YEAR.:**

- I. **Page 4 T1:** Percentage difference in column 4 and column 2 is approximately 6%. This is better than the past and closer to the 3% target.
- II. **Page 8 T35:**
  - a. *Facilities and improvements-* the only significant facility improvement was carpet added to the boys' basketball locker room. Girls' locker room will receive carpet next year.
  - b. *Publications-* We publish an All-Sports Program that includes all sports. We have one for fall, winter and spring sports. Advertisement is sold and Any proceeds go to the entire athletic department.
  - c. *Budgeted Money-* Due to the restructuring of our Athletic Booster Club and the elimination of our Bingo operation, it was decided not to budget any set amount of money to individual sports this year. Each sport has 2 accounts at SCHS. One is an administrative account in which all basic expenses are paid, such as officials, fees, and basic equipment. The other account is that sport's fund-raising account in which all money they fund-raise goes into. Coaches can use that money for "extras" for their programs. When the school year is ending, we will evaluate the status of our financial accounts and may then allot money to individual sports programs.
- III. **Page 10 T41:**

The only advantage to one program was the girls' in regards to coaching as the girls' head coaches had more years of experience, 131 total years compared to 51 total years experience for boys' programs and also a higher head coach salary of \$30,760 compared to boys' head coaches \$23,876.50.


