### Travel

Travel expenses documented on forms T35 and T36 represent money for teams that advanced to State Tournament competition. The boys basketball team advanced to the All "A" Classic in Richmond and that accounts for the travel expense. Golf represents boys since we have no girls interested in participating. In the cases of swimming, cross country, and track the money spent is not gender specific as individuals competing in state events traveled together as a team.
