- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. - Swimming, golf, and tennis (girls and boys transportation) provided by their parents.
- Travel for football includes two buses. Beechwood Board of Education policy requires chartered buses for trips over 100 miles. Thus the expense for the playoff game at Middlesboro and the State Championship game in Louisville. The athletic department also gave money to Girls and Basketball and baseball for their trip, as well as the boys' baseball trip to Bullitt Co.
- Reconditioning of football equipment included in expenses.
- Softball and baseball travel and umpire fees are estimated as season has just started.
- The athletic boosters had a fall sports program for football, volleyball, and golf (girls and boys). Again, the winter sports program was cancelled due to lack of sales.
- Coaches and salaries are attached. Salaries are based on the number of year's experience.
- As of 4/4 03 we have not received a bill for leveling of the baseball/softball field. (appx. Cost \$500.00)

# Form T 2

Due to lack of participation Beechwood had to cancel varsity fast pitch softball. But our numbers increased in girls basketball, so we re-instated freshman girls basketball.

**Cheerleaders** are not used in any of our calculations. They are selected for varsity, JV, and freshman football and basketball teams. They cheer football in the fall, and equal number girls and boys home basketball games in the winter.

# **Equipment and Supplies**

Each year head coaches turn in requests for equipment and supplies. Teams cannot be supplied new uniforms every year so coaches often only get replacements for lost or damaged uniforms. We rotate the purchasing of new uniforms.

Most athletes purchase their own practice gear and/or game gear. Examples of purchased items include:

Football – game and practice jerseys Softball and baseball – practice uniforms Tennis and golf – game gear Volleyball – practice shorts Swim – game swim suits All individuals buy their own shoes.

# **Medical Services**

Beechwood Board of Education hired a full time Nova Care Athletic Trainer who is present at all home contests and available during practices. At away games most Northern Kentucky schools provide a certified athletic trainer.

We do have a team doctor available during contact sports, such as football.
