

The return rate on the student survey was 55%. The school needs to initiate a method that provides a higher rate of return from the student body. - 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
