



- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom sqads). Calculate the same way for boys and girls. \* In addition, should 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and below play on a Freshman, Junior Varsity, or Varsity team, they should also be counted for each team and sport on which they participate. If applicable, please asterisk the above notation as to how many 8<sup>th</sup> grade students & below are included in the totals. Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.
- Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
  Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.



### Title IX Action Plan School Year 2002-2003

A new set of varsity uniforms was purchased for the girls basketball team in the fall of 2002. This allowed the varsity uniforms from the previous season to be used by the freshman and junior varsity teams.

Metal lockers in the girls and boys locker rooms located in the school were replaced with wood lockers in the fall of 2002.

During the 2002-2003 school year the girls basketball team played on 8 prime time nights. During the 2001-2002 school year the girls team played on 5 prime time nights.

Boys and girls track, baseball, and softball uniforms were purchased in the spring of 2003.

An outfield fence was erected at the baseball field in the spring of 2003.

Metal roofs were added the dugouts at the softball field.

A new set varsity uniforms will be purchased for the boys basketball team in the fall of 2003. This will allow the present varsity uniforms to be used by the junior varsity and freshman teams.

The girls basketball team will play on 11 prime time nights during the 2003-2004 season.

A written Uniform Replacement Policy will be established.

A written document will be established that designates locker room assignments for all athletic teams.

A posted weight room training schedule will be posted in the weight room located at the football field house. The gender equity committee will study the feasibility of adding a weight room at the school building. This room could be used by all athletic teams as well as physical education classes.

The gender equity committee will discuss with the school administration the need to add more staff coaches for the girls athletic teams. Bethlehem is a small school with a low teacher turn over. The gender equity committee will ask as teaching positions come open to consider applicants with coaching experience.
