The Title IX Committee recently met to discuss the problem noted on last years Title IX audit dealing with cheerleading. The committee has decided to recommend the following changes that will begin in the 2003-04 school year. This criterion should assure compliance and provide for equitable squads for boys and girls athletic teams. The new criterion is described below.

Betsy Layne High School will consolidate the two current cheerleading squads into one squad. This squad will cheer at all football games, home basketball games (boys & girls), all away District basketball games (boys & girls) and tournaments. This policy will take effect beginning with the 2003-04 school year. All other requirements as previously adopted will continue (attendance, GPA, etc.).
