D.	Other Recommendation and Comments On Form GE19, it is noted that student-athletes do not appear as members of the school's Gender Equity Review Committee. It is recommended that this oversight be corrected. It is noted that all three committee meetings were in the spring sport season rather than the recommended fall/winter/spring. Forms T-2 & T-4 indicate a difference in the figures that should be reflected in the number of interscholastic participants on the T-1 report. Please make the correction on your school forms and place in the school's Title IX file. Forms T-35 and T-36 are areas of concern at which the Gender Equity Review Committee need to take a serious look. The KHSAA Audit Team will continue to monitor this situation. Forms T-35 & T-36 are being returned with RED CIRCLES around the areas of concern. Also of concern is the overall amount spent on boys (\$48,364.66) as compared to girls (\$30,985.20). School personnel are, by August 15, 2003, to submit a report to the KHSAA that will explain these disparities as well as any corrective action that may be needed.

Re: Title IX Visit

Dear Peggy Kemp:

Pursuant to 702 KAR 7:065, the Kentucky High School Athletic Association has been directed to assist member schools in monitoring compliance with Title IX. Part of this assessment process includes reviewing the progress schools are making with their Gender Equity Review Committees and Title IX plans. Twenty percent of the KHSAA membership will be visited this year, and subsequent years until every school has been visited. KHSAA Audit Staff members may be accompanied by KDE personnel on these visits.

We have scheduled March 4th as the audit date for Hopkinsville High School. The audit will begin at 2:30 P.M., and will consist of the following, in this order:

- The Athletic Director or school representative should be prepared to accompany the KHSAA auditors on a tour of all athletic facilities, including all locker rooms, all meeting rooms, coaches' offices, storage facilities, all practice and competition areas, and any other facility used by the athletic department.
- On display for the KHSAA auditors to review should be **examples of team uniforms** from each boys' and girls' athletic team.
- The KHSAA auditors will meet with your school's Gender Equity Review Committee
 at approximately 4:00 P.M. All committee members, if possible, should be in attendance,
 particularly your school's Title IX Coordinator. During this meeting, the KHSAA auditors
 will discuss your athletic program in detail. Your Gender Equity Review Committee
 should be prepared with pertinent information pertaining to your school's original 19992000 Audit Document and updated 2001-2002 Title IX forms.
- The KHSAA auditors will conduct a public comment session at 6:00 P.M. for the purpose of allowing any interested parties the opportunity to ask questions regarding gender equity and Title IX, as well as the overall athletics program at your school. Members of your administrative staff and representatives of your Title IX Committee should be present for this session. The KHSAA will alert the local media of this session in order to notify interested parties who may wish to attend.

All lights were purchased by the Christian County Board of Education. Baseball parents and committee members have attended board meetings in the past to discuss this inequity. The board agreed that this needed to be corrected; however, due to the short fall in funds, the purchase was to be delayed another year. This has continued to be a delay through the 2002-2003 school year also. This inequity was brought to the board of education again this year. The Hopkinsville High School Athletic Department, Hopkinsville High School Baseball Boosters, and the Christian County Board of Education have agreed to share in the funding of this project. The committee will have to monitor this inequity for the coming 2003-2004 school year.
