- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. To Whom It May Concern:

The Mayfield High School Athletic Booster Club has built a new athletic training facility for all Mayfield High School athletes. This facility contains a new, all-sports weight room, one girls locker room for girls track, girls softball, and girls soccer. The new facility contains one boys locker room for football, boys track, and baseball. It also has one classroom, one football coaches' office, and a training room for all sports.

With this addition of this facility, we have gone from three boys' locker rooms and one girls' locker rooms, to three boys' locker rooms and three girls' locker rooms, plus each sport now has sufficient amounts of storage space for uniforms and equipment.

After the completion of this building approximately \$5,500 was spent on renovation of our boys and girls basketball locker rooms.

The total cost of the new training center itself was \$381,452.44, plus \$31,264.74 was spent to buy new athletic lockers. This is a great new facility and will benefit all of Mayfield High School's athletes.
