1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom sqads). 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# APPENDIX A

The following items give further detailed explanations regarding data collected for the KHSAA Title IX Member Schools 2001-2002 Annual Report

- 1. Form T41—The Advantage shown to the Boys' Program under 'Coaching' was designated as the total amount of coaching salaries allocated to coaches exceeds that of the Girls' Program. (See Appendix B—District Coaching Salary Schedule.)
- 2. Forms T35 & T36-
  - I have created two separate tables for each, to reflect Budget & Expenditures at both the (1) High School Activity/Booster Account Level, and (2) District Athletic Funding Level.
  - There is no set Budget for each of the High School Activity/Booster Accounts. The amount of Expenditures is based on each team's willingness to participate in fund raising activities (as approved by School Principal). The large discrepancy between Boys' Basketball and all other accounts is due in large part to numerous fund raising activities, which allowed the team to take a trip to Florida during the 2001-2002 school year. We experienced a similar situation last year when Girls' Softball took a similar trip during the previous year.
  - There is no set Budget for Travel, Awards, or Facilities Improvements from the District Athletic Allocations. The district allocates a stipend to McCreary Central to fund all teams' transportation accounts. Awards are to be comparable between Boys'/Girls' teams. Facilities Improvements are implemented based on need.
