- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. ### STATUS REPORT 3/3/03

### CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN, 1999-2000:

The first item of the Corrective Action Plan for this year concerned the inequitable number of prime time nights scheduled for the Girls and Boys Basketball Programs. By the following season, the numbers had been improved, although this GEC mistakenly considered Tuesday to be a prime time night. Nevertheless, the GEC decided to continue with this item on the next year's Corrective Action Plan. The next season saw very little improvement in the inequity, and the AD worked very closely with the coaches to bring a substantial reduction to this disparity for the 2002-2003 seasons.

The second item of the 1999-2000 plan concerned the cheerleading schedule for the Green and White squads. Prior to this, the Green squad, the more talented and experienced, had been cheering primarily for the Boys' Basketball team and the White squad had been cheering for the Girls' games. The AD worked with the Cheer coaches to develop a schedule for the Green squad to cheer for an equal number of Boys' and Girls' games. This schedule has been followed for the past three seasons and will continue to be implemented in the future.

### CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN, 2000-2001;

As discussed above, the scheduling of prime time Girls' Basketball games again was a concern. The improvement was minimal, and the AD will continue to work to correct the problem.

The other item on this year's plan concerned the radio broadcasts of basketball games by the local AM station, WMMG. The inequity existed when both teams were playing on the same night. The station tended to air the broadcast of the Boys' game instead of the Girls'. The AD met with the station manager, who assured him that the problem could be corrected. The AD met with her again to thank her for her support of both programs and asked that the practice be continued. The station manager now submits her broadcast schedule prior to the start of the season and it becomes part of the permanent Title IX file.

### CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN, 2001-2002:

Prime-time scheduling continued to concern the GEC, and they decided to renew the efforts to reach compliance. The AD met with the two basketball coaches (who do their own scheduling) and informed them that compliance was an absolute necessity. They were very cooperative and were able to close the gap with a margin of 10-9 in favor of the boys. This is a significant improvement and the AD will continue the effort.

Following the recommendation of the KHSAA, the GEC also felt that certain policies concerning gender equity and athletics needed to be in a written form. To accomplish this, the AD first collected responses from all head coaches for analysis. A sub-committee was then formed to actually write the policies. These were then approved by the GEC and became part of the permanent Title IX file.
