- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.

Enclosed please find the Owensboro High School Title IX 2002-2003 Annual Report. The report was reviewed by our Gender Equity Committee on April 9,2003.

Coaching salaries in the district on this report were based on a percentage applied to the base salary of a teaching rank. The increment schedule for the district now allocates a specified amount for each coaching position, which is added to the instructional salary of the coach. The effect is identical coaching salaries for similar positions in both girls and boys sports. The girls and boys varsity basketball coaches, for example, are currently receiving an identical coaching increment. Formerly, a coach with a higher instructional teaching rank would receive a higher coaching salary.

As a new Athletic Director I wanted to see how long it took one person to hand count and tabulate the data required on the Student Summary Form. The time involved was three eight-hour days. Is there not a way to structure the Student Survey so that it could be scored on a Scantron or some other more efficient method?

We will be happy to answer any questions you may have regarding information in the report and look forward to working to assure gender equity in every athletic program at Owensboro High School.
