	Other Recommendation and Comments: School personnel did not address any items for correction. In reviewing the December audit report, the school had several deficiencies. School personnel have not adequately addressed the softball facility. Regardless of whether the school uses city property or school property, it is school personnel's responsibility to select sites that assure equity of like-sports. Only 25% of all girls' basketball games were played in "prime time" in 2002-2003, and only 12% of home games were played in "prime time". The KHSAA will continue to monitor these areas. Expenditures for equipment and supplies for girls' and boys' basketball on the 2002-2003 report indicate inequities in spending for like-sports.

Rose Hill continues to show progress toward an equitable salar coaches. For basketball, track, and tennis, the girls coach and t received the same pay. The boys' soccer coach received \$950.00 while the girls' soccer coach received \$600.00. However, the same individual coached both teams. The area discrepancy was in baseball, where the coaches received \$1,300.00 whereas the softball coaches received \$500.00. Softball was a new sport in 2001-2002 and originally was not included in the budget.

2. Selection of cheerleaders for boys and girls games

Rose Hill has only one cheerleading squad and it serves both the girls team and the boys team.

3. Prime time scheduling

Rose Hill has not finalized its boys and girls basketball schedules for 2003-2004. It is attempting to equalized prime time games for boys and girls. Scheduling is being done with the goal of correcting any difference. Schedules will be provided to KHSAA upon completion.

Plan for Improvement of Softball Field

As noted in the Title IX Final Audit Report, the school uses, both for baseball and softball, facilities owned and maintained by the City of Ashland. The school uses these facilities free of charge and has no input on control in regard to needed improvements.

The audit specifically mentions the absence of a concession stand, press box, and scoreboard at the softball field. A mobile concession stand is now brought in for softball games. Although the city has continued to make improvements to the field, it has not added a press box or a scoreboard.

The school is looking for another facility which meets the standards as set forth in the audit report. To date, other local schools have been unwilling to lease their facilities to Rose Hill. The Southside Park has been our only choice. However, it is our goal to provide equal facilities for baseball and softball.

Equitable Salary Schedule for Coaches in Comparable Sports

Rose Hill is committed to equity in pay to coaches in comparable sports. The school's 2002-2003 Title IX report indicates that all coaches in comparable sports are paid the same except in baseball-softball and girls and boys soccer.

The boys baseball coach, a veteran of many years in coaching including several years as head baseball coach at Kentucky Christian College, was paid \$1,300.00. His counterpart in girls fast pitch softball is a local minister who had no coaching experience and was paid \$500.00. The difference was strictly because of experience. Neither sport produces any revenue whatsoever.

The difference in the pay to the soccer coaches is not really an issue because the same individual coached both teams.

It is Rose Hill's policy to pay coaches in comparable sports equally with the only difference, if applicable, being because of level of experience. The school's sports committee is working on a pay schedule. However, the vast majority of the school's revenue in sports comes from boys basketball. It has been good the last two years. However, the school anticipates a drastic reduction in this revenue next school year. Therefore, the pay schedule realistically cannot be finalized until the availability of funds is known.
