The following reflects the "Prime Time/Prime Night" Home scheduling of the Butler Traditional High School Girls and Boys Varsity Basketball Schedule for the 2005-2006 season.

The Girls Varsity Basketball team played seven home basketball games for the 2005-2006 season. The Boys Varsity Basketball team played seven home basketball games for the 2005-2006 season.

The breakdown of the seven girls games are as follows:
