

For Evart High School and Cumberland High School.

According to the KHSAA Title IX 2004-05 Re-Visit Final Audit Report for both Cumberland & Evarts High Schools there was a deficiency found in section #4 in the category referred to in the report as "locker rooms, practice, & competitive facilities" with the same deficiency being mentioned in section #8 of both reports. The Evarts High School deficiency specifically states that "the softball field has basically the same amenities as the baseball field, but the baseball dugouts, fencing, press box, storage, and field drainage system all appear to be of higher quality": while the deficiency from Cumberland High School states that "the school has made improvements at the softball facility; however, disparity between baseball and softball facilities still exists.

As you may be aware, the Harlan County Public Schools System is in the process of consolidating all three of its high schools into one centralized facility. At this point we have already begun building a bridge and excavating the site for the new Harlan County High School, actual construction of the main building and athletic facilities will begin within the next few months.

During the process of consolidation it was necessary to liquidate properties that are no longer of use to our school system. The old Verda Elementary School and the property that surrounded it, which included the Evarts High School softball facility, were recently sold by the Harlan County Public Schools System. Kentucky law forbids the district from allocating funds for the maintenance or renovation of facilities which they do not own. However, the contract for the sale includes specific provisions for the purchaser to maintain the field until the new softball field is completed at the new high school site. We wanted The KHSAA to be aware of our situation and to be assured that the Evarts softball field will be maintained until all new facilities are completed with complete gender equity in mind.

It may also be noted that the field used by the Cumberland baseball team is not owned by the county but is leased from South East Community College. This may account for the discrepancies noted in the KHSAA report regarding the condition of the softball field compared to the baseball field.

The deficiencies specified in section #8 of both school's KHSAA Audit Reports will be completely rectified with the construction of the new softball facility. Site preparation and excavation are at the location of the new school are ongoing as this letter is being drafted.
