Summary of Expenditures

On the T35 form, you will see that both baseball and softball had significant expenditures. About \$14,000 goes into a Florida Spring Break trip that they both take and I divided it up equally between the two teams. They raise most of the money through fundraising and pay for the rest. I didn't know exactly where to include it, but I know it needed to be added.

Also, if you look at our facilities improvement expenditures, you can see that we spent a considerable amount on soccer and football. This money was received through a grant (crumb rubber) that we applied for to improve our multipurpose field (football, soccer). It was about a \$21,000 grant and I divided it up equally among the three sports that used the field. \$14,000 went to football and boys soccer, while \$7000 went to girls soccer.

The booster expenditures are based on the number of players in each sport. Our booster club gives each sport \$30 dollars per player and that money goes directly into their account. The booster club president and members have voted on this and they give me the responsibility of allocating the proper funds to each respective sport. I will then give the booster club the breakdown of how many players were in each sport and how much they received.
