# CALVARY CHRISTIAN GUIDELINES FOR TRANSPORTATION

**Explanation:** CCS requires its athletes to pay a sports fee for each sport that a student participates in. The cost is \$55.00 for a fall sport, \$55.00 for a winter sport, and \$55.00 for a spring sport. A portion of the sports fee is designated to the transportation fee. \$10.00 of each athletes sports fee is transferred into the transportation fund.

#### Modes of Transportation:

CCS utilizes the following modes of transportation for its athletic teams.

- 1. CCS maintains four buses that are available for teams to use.
- 2. Coaches who have their CDL may reserve these buses to use on game days.
- 3. Parents of players or other bus drivers at CCS with their CDL may drive the buses.
- 4. When #2 or #3 cannot be utilized, CCS contracts Paul's Bus Service out of Cincinnati, Ohio to drive the teams to and from the games.

#### Payment for Transportation:

CCS transportation includes each aspect of school life. This includes field trips, sporting events, and other special trips. These areas are all paid for from the same transportation fund. The School does not separate or breakdown the individual costs regarding these areas. The athletic department responsibility is to contribute \$10.00 equally from girls and boys sports fees who participate on athletic teams in the fall, winter, and spring season.
