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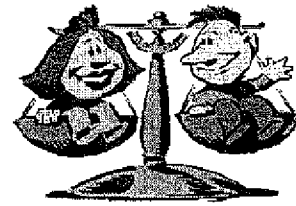
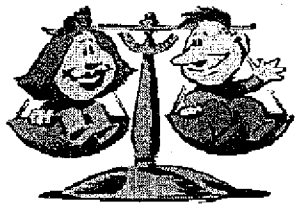

D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: T1 - I find that 51.8% of the total athletic participation is female. The T36 shows 56% of the total budget expenditures are spent on the boys. Last year you spent \$253 per male athlete, this year you spent \$577 per male this year. Last year you spent \$151 per female athlete, this year you spent \$427 per female athlete. The difference last year in male/female spending was \$102. The difference this year is \$150. When you are a football playing school and are above a \$100 difference in male/female spending, you are in a grey area and the Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at and address a potential red flag issue in this area. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at the area of awards. Every sport received \$100 from the school with the exception of Boys/Girls Cross Country. The 2007 Annual Report was a much better overall report. Corrective action for the future looks good. No report is given on the progress of the Weight Room upgrade. Please submit a report so your folder can be updated to show these improvements.



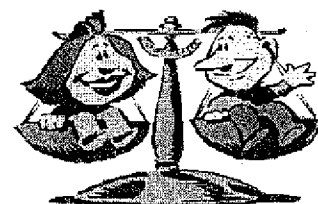
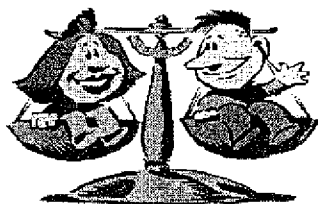

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event.
