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You will notice that the entries on the financial page do not include amounts filled in on many of the sports for the Travel expense.

In the past our payroll clerk has kept the Trip Sheets and I would contact her for copies when I began preparing my report. This year, she told me that the superintendent had the Trip Sheets for last year. When I requested those from our superintendent, she told me that she could not locate them. She has been unable to do so over the past 3 or 4 weeks. This will not be a problem in the future because the payroll clerk and I had determined at the beginning of the school year that it would be easier if she sent those to me monthly and I would then have them ready for next year. So since the beginning of the school year, she has been sending me those.

I emailed Mr. Boucher and explained what had happened. He said to include an explanation with the report and that we already have a corrective action plan in place. I did list travel for a few sports in the report. This includes travel to Christmas tournaments for both boys and girls basketball teams as well as travel expenses for all basketball coaches to the state tournament. There are also entries for softball and baseball coaches because they attended clinics.

All of our sports are transported on our school busses and are driven by our own drivers. Most of our sports compete at the same schools so they travel about the same number of miles each year.

I hope this explains what happens and how I have corrected the problem.

Mr. Boucher,

I sent an email yesterday concerning my Title IX report but we were having trouble with our email and I didn't realize it at the time. So I am sending another one just to make sure that you receive it. My problem concerns the trip sheets for our away athletic events. Our payroll clerk who has always keep those in the past informed me about a month ago when I asked for copies that the superintendent had the trip sheets for last year. I then asked our superintendent for copies so I could compute the travel expenses per sport for the report. She said that she couldn't find them. This problem will not occur in the future because the payroll clerk and I had already decided that it would be easier if she sent them to me monthly so I could file them away for next year's report. So I will have all of the trip sheets for this year already in hand. The problem is that I have no way of computing the expenses for last year. We use the same busses and bus drivers for all of our sports and our teams play basically the same teams so the distance is about the same every year.

Please advise me on how to handle this on my Title IX report. I have everything else completed and ready to submit to your office.
