The gender equity committee held its first meeting for the year. Present were Amy Boaz, Tom Hulsey, Henry Edwards, Frank Brazzell and Perry Collins. Absent were Joan Lacewell and the student representative.

The Title IX 2005 report was discussed and comments were made. Henry Edwards reported improvements were being made on the new softball field. The field should be completed by the spring softball season. He also reported the girls' soccer schedule has been cancelled for this season due to a lack of numbers. Hopefully numbers will pick up next year and the team will be back on schedule. He reported practice continues for a girls' volleyball team. We have fifteen participants and we plan on playing a junior varsity schedule this fall. A coach is in place and a volleyball clinic has been held by a local university assistant coach. Plans are to play varsity competitions next year and be a member of the first district. Mr. Edwards has notified the K.H.S.A.A. in a written letter of the plans. Boys soccer and golf season are under way with practices and matches being held. The Heat Index factor was discussed and precautions are being taken to monitor this at all matches. The meeting was adjourned.
