D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: The boys have an advantage in the benefit of Support Services. The advantage was not addressed on T-41 nor was it mentioned on the schools Corrective Action Plan. The school spent \$241 more per athlete on male students according to the Annual Report for 2005-2006. According to information submitted by the school on the 2006-2007 Annual Report the school is spending #323 more per male athlete. The school administration and the Gender Equity Committee needs to examine the expenditures and spending to ensure equity in benefits received by boys and girls. The committee should address this matter at the first meeting of the 2007-2008 school year.

Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).

- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom sqads). - 1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
- 2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
