#### Status Report on 2005-2006 Title IX Corrective Action Plan

Update on progress during 2005-06 school year.

#### 1. Locker Room Improvements---G-BKB

The problem in this area continues to exist. However, completion of the new Academic-Athletic Facility during the summer of 2007 will allow the school to address this issue. When this facility opens, the school will implement its plan to relocate some locker rooms to address this issue. (Copy of Plan Attached)

#### 2. Individual Sports Fundraising—Inequities

There continues to be an on-going effort to educate parents, coaches and booster club on this issue. NOTE: The 2005-06 finances saw some inequity in spending between baseball and softball from the booster club. However, this was due to the fact that some renovations were completed at the baseball field following the completion of the new softball facility during the 2004-05 school year.

The Athletic Booster Club looked at their documented spending history over the last 4-5 years and targeted 4 sports for assistance during the 2006-07 school year. These sports were Cross Country, Tennis, Swimming and Golf. The club was able to provide assistance to three of these four groups and plans to offer golf assistance in the fall of 2007.

The athletic department continues to encourage joint fund-raising where possible.

#### 3. Girl's Participation Levels

We have seen an increase in participation in the sports of tennis (increase of 21) and track (increase of 11). With these increased numbers we've started a limited JV schedule in these sports to allow the students in these programs an opportunity to compete. We did however see a slight decrease in numbers for girl's golf and cross country (1 or 2 per sport).

#### 4. Awards Policy

The athletic department has worked to develop a more uniform awards policy for all sports including requirements for earning a varsity awards letter for each sport as well as the level of spending for awards by each sport. Completed 2006-07 school year.
