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It appears that our boys versus girls spending is out of line at first glance. However, with football in the equation as a major contributor the numbers are really skewed. The total football expenditures for the 2005-06 year was \$93,865.00. If you subtract that number from the total spending of boys versus girls you will find that the percentages of spending really change. The percentage goes from 59% for boys and 41% for girls to 43% for boys and 57% for girls. With the high cost of equipment for football, there appears to be no way to successfully adjust expenditures of boys versus girls and still maintain a safe playing environment. We will continue to monitor football spending so as not to allow it to get totally out of hand. However, we will not sacrifice the safety of any of our student athletes for the sake of money.
