Awards/Recognition Policy

The policy states 2 years as a varsity team member and playing in half the quarters from those two years. Jackets are to be presented at the end of the junior year season.

The Athletic Department will develop sport specific criteria for the earning of letters and bars. NCHS Athletic Dept will furnish the letters, bars, and patches that are earned by our student-athletes, but will not supply jackets. The purchase of jackets can be underwritten by a sport's booster club, or can be purchased at any time by any student participating in any NCHS extracurricular activity.

Also, please see a listing of the following conditions.

- 1. A support/booster organization using external accounts shall not use the state tax exempt or federal identification number of the school or district, but shall obtain a state exempt number specifically and use only for the use of the support/booster organization.
- 2. Submit the names of the club officers to the principal at the beginning of each school year.
- 3. All items ordered through the support/boosters shall not be ordered through the school or sent to the school address.
 - 4. Ensure funds are expended in accordance with the purpose and intended us only.
 - 5. Submit financial reports by the 10th of each month.
 - 6. Submit yearly financial report to the principal by July 10 for the prior school year.
- 7. Ensure compliance with Title IX issues as it relates to fund-raising and expenditures.
- 8. Be reminded that no student shall be compelled to participate or meet any kind of quota in a fund-raising activities.

Nicholas County Schools ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into by and between the Nicholas County Board of Education (hereafter referred to as "Board) and an entity known as **Nicholas County Parents for Baseball** (hereafter referred to as the "Booster Club"). Through this Agreement, the parties intend to set forth the Terms and Conditions under which the Booster Club may operate and associate with students, teachers, coaches and school administrators at Nicholas County High School.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Booster Club acknowledges that the Board is responsible for the promotion of education and the general health and welfare of all students attending the Nicholas County Public Schools. In addition, the Booster Club acknowledges that the Board has control and management of funds for all public school property in its district and may use its funds and property to promote public education (KRS 160.290).
- 2. The Booster Club acknowledges that its activities may affect compliance with Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 (Title 20, U.S.C. 1681-1687, et seq.) by Nicholas County High School and the Board. Likewise, the Booster Club acknowledges that, as a condition of membership in the Kentucky High School Athletic Association, representatives of Nicholas County High School and the Board must verify that the school complies with Title IX. 702 KAR 7:065, Section 2 (13). Accordingly, the Booster Club agrees to provide all information requested by Nicholas County High School, the Board, or the Kentucky High School Athletic Association for purposes of determining Title IX compliance. The Booster Club further agrees to refrain from engaging in any activity which, in the opinion of the principal or athletic director of Nicholas County High school or the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools, adversely affects the school's or the Board ability to comply with Title IX.
- 3. The Booster Club shall, on or before August 15th of each year designate a representative for purposes of communicating with and providing true and accurate information to the Board and Nicholas County High School.
- 4. Upon request of the principal or athletic director of Nicholas County High School, or upon request of the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools, the Booster Club shall make available a full and complete list of its members.
- 5. In addition to complying with the requirements of Title 702 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations, Chapter 3:130 (internal accounting, and all other relevant statutes and regulations, the Booster Club shall, upon the request of the principal or athletic director of Nicholas County High School, or on the request of the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools, provide a full and complete accounting of all moneys raised, as well as a full and complete accounting of all moneys expended. In addition, if requested to do so, the Booster Club shall also provide audited financial records concerning its activities.
- 6. On or before September 30 of each year, the Booster Club shall advise the principal and athletic director of Nicholas County High School of all fund raising activities planned for the upcoming year. To the extent the Booster Club seeks to engage in additional fund raising activities, it shall give at least 10 days notice if the intended activity.

- 7. The principal and athletic director of Nicholas County High School and the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools expressly reserve the right to reject any fund raising activity for any reason. The Booster Club agrees that it shall not engage in any fund raising activity which has not been approved or which has been rejected by the principal or athletic director of Nicholas County High School or the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools.
- 8. By executing this document through its designated representative, all members, officers, and representatives of the Booster Club agree to abide by the terms and conditions set forth below as well as those additional terms and conditions which may be required by the Board. The designated representative of the Booster Club represents and agrees that he/she will provide a copy of this agreement to all members of the Booster Club.

I hereby acknowledge that I am a representative of the **Nicholas County Parents for Baseball** and that I am authorized to act on its behalf. I further agree that this Booster Club and its members shall abide by the Terms and Conditions set forth above. I further agree to immediately report to the principal and athletic director of Nicholas County High School and to the Superintendent of the Nicholas County Public Schools any violation or breach of this agreement.
