D.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: The school did not list any student names as members of the Gender Equity Committee. Student membership and participation is a vital part of this committee's make-up. The school listed student participants last year on the Annual Report for 2005-2006. The school did not use the most updated forms which are on the KHSAA Website, therefore the school was unaware that the column for Coaches requested the number of coaches to be listed rather than Booster. The school spent approximately \$154 more on male athletes, however this is an improvement from last years spending of \$490. It appears the school is still in negotiations regarding the softball field at Phelps High School. This matter has been on-going for several years, therefore leaving the girls at a disadvantage regarding the softball facilities. This disadvantage was not so noted on Form T-41.

 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
