Follow-Up to Student Interscholastic Survey 2006-2007 (Part I)

Based on the student surveys a need has been identified to explore the possibility of accommodating interest in swimming and diving. Eleven (11) female students indicated that they had an interest in competing in the sport.

In order to assess the legitimacy of the responses and viability of adding a new program, a meeting has been announced for Thursday March 29th, 2007. Announcements were made during our all school morning meetings beginning Monday March 26th, 2007 continuing through the day of the actual meeting.

Details of the Follow-Up Meeting

At the meeting on March 29, 2007 only two girls showed up (Ariel Bendon and Hannah Ritter). Ariel indicated a legitimate interest in participating, however, Hannah Ritter was unsure if she could actually participate due to her ballet schedule. The two girls who attended the meeting also stated that Hannah Greene was interested, but she was absent on the meeting day and could not attend.

Conclusions from Meeting

Even if all three girls would participate, there is still not enough legitimate interest to warrant adding a new team. Other considerations include the cost of hiring a coach, renting a pool facility to practice since the school does not have a swimming pool, and purchasing of uniforms and equipment. Also, Ariel Bendon will be a senior in the upcoming year leaving the team with only one or two returning members the following year. At this time, the level of legitimate interest does not warrant adding this sport at this time. However, if the level of interest does change in the future this issue should be revisited.

Follow-Up to Student Interscholastic Survey 2006-2007 (Part II)

Based on the student surveys a need has been identified to explore the possibility of accommodating interest in girls' lacrosse. Fourteen (14) female students indicated they had an interest in competing in the sport.

A previous attempt to start a girls' lacrosse team proved largely unsuccessful and costly for the school. In the 2003-2004 school year, equipment and other necessary preparations were made to start a girls' lacrosse team as enough girls had signed up and indicated an interest to play. However, when it became time to begin practice there were not enough girls committed to actually field a team.

Action Plan

At the beginning of the 2007-2008 school year, the students will be surveyed again to gauge their interest in competing in girls' lacrosse. If enough students indicate that they would like to play, a follow-up meeting will be held to discuss specifics regarding practice, time commitments, and equipment costs. At this point, if there are enough students still interested in playing we will actively pursue adding girls' lacrosse for the Spring 2008 season.

Explanation of Advantages

Based upon the Title IX report there were three areas where advantages are seen with respect to boys' sports.

Accommodation of Interests

Currently we have five boys' varsity sports and one junior varsity boys' sport compared with only four girls' varsity sports. The girls do not have a junior varsity basketball team (the boys did have a junior varsity basketball team) as they did not have enough numbers to field an additional team. Also, we have one additional varsity sport for boys that the girls do not have. Our goal is to increase the level of female participation in an effort to equalize the number of varsity sports for both girls and boys.

Equipment and Supplies

Based on the 2005-2006 expenditures more money was spent on boys' sports than on girls. New uniforms were purchased for the boys' soccer team resulting in a \$3,000 expenditure. New girls' basketball uniforms were ordered in 2005-2006, but due to the change in athletic directors at the end of school year the invoice was not paid until after the fiscal year had ended and could not be properly credited to last year's expenditures. The soccer uniforms were purchased in accordance with the three year uniform review cycle.

Coaching Salaries

More money was also spent on boys' coaches as well. Currently, we have one additional sport for boys' and are paying approximately an extra \$3,500 on a coach where there is no comparable girls' team. It was also noted that the boys' tennis coach made \$1,500 more than the girls' tennis coach last year. The boys' coach has superior credentials with respect to his coaching resume and has coached at the school for several years. The girls' tennis coach was a first year coach last year and was not retained to complete the year although he was paid his full salary. All coaching salaries are determined by qualifications, years of prior experience, and years of coaching at the school. All returning coaches who have performed adequately receive a standard raise in their coaching stipend each year.

Title IX Committee Meeting Minutes December 5th, 2006

Attendance: Jason G. Bell, Athletic Director Kit Llewellyn College Counselor Olivia Netzler Asst. Athletic Director

Jason Bell, Athletic Director presided over the meeting to discuss issues identified in the Title IX workshop attended by him and Asst. Athletic Director Olivia Netzler.

- 1) Began meeting with discussion of information learned from the Title IX workshop held in Somerset. First and foremost is the need to have a committee made up students, school personnel, and parents. Then Jason Bell, went through the areas that the committee should be concerned with. Special emphasis was placed on expenditures as this was identified as a potential problem area in the past.
- 2) Minutes must be taken at all meetings, cannot simply have meeting agendas on file. Assistant AD will remain Title IX coordinator, however, we need to add parents, students, and our Head of School to the committee. One girls' coach needs to be on the committee as well.
- 3) Need to write policies including the following information: meal/travel, banner/poster/retirement of jerseys, awards policy, facilities use/scheduling, locker room assignments, booster policy-spending of funds.
- 4) Committee should review practice/game field sites and conditions, coaching salaries, budget/expenditures, total gender expenditures.
- 5) Need to obtain master Title IX file from the KHSAA (10 cents per page).
- 6) Need to establish a corrective action plan to finish the year and be implemented the following year.

Jason bell, athletic director, presided over our initial meeting and outlined his goals for the committee.

First, we need to form a committee of at least 8 members including the Head of School, Athletic Director, Basketball Coach Tony Butler, Field hockey Coach Christy Hershey, Kit Llewellyn (committee secretary/alum parent/college advisor), 2 Parents(TBA) and 2 Students(TBA).

Secondly, we need to compile a survey of present students' interests in athletics/teams

Thirdly, we need to obtain copies from KHSAA of our title IX reviews/paper work so that we have a concrete understanding of what was or was not in place prior to Jason Bell's tenure at St. Francis High School

At this point, we will convene every two weeks, the next meeting being February 26 in the College Resource Room at 9:00 am
