

RE: Apollo's 2007-2008 Title IX Annual Report

Mr. Boucher,

Enclosed you will find the 2007-2008 Title IX self audit for Apollo High School. Everything is complete and in good order. However, I want to take a moment to address a couple of items.

First, on forms T-35 and T-36 (actual expenditures) you will notice that no dollar values were inserted for the "Booster" columns. The reason for this has to do with how Apollo Athletics and how the Athletic Booster Club is organized.

First, there is only one athletic booster club at Apollo. (Individual sports are not allowed to have their own booster clubs specific to their team.) Its account is operated through the Apollo High School bookkeeper. The sole function of the Apollo Athletic Booster Club is to raise money for the overall athletic budget which is \$102,000. This \$102,000 funds all 19 sports as well as the cheer and dance teams. The Apollo Athletic Booster Club raises money by running all concessions at all sporting events, booster club memberships, and the annual Chili Supper. *EVERY DOLLAR* that the Apollo Athletic Booster Club raises goes directly towards meeting the overall athletic budget of \$102,000. The Apollo Athletic Booster Club does not make individual purchases for any sport. Therefore, there are no expenditures to report for any sport from the Apollo Athletic Boosters.

It should be noted that each sport may supplement the budget provided by Apollo via a maximum of two fundraisers. The fundraisers are conducted at the discretion of the head coach. Parents and/or other "boosters" do not have the ability to choose to conduct a fundraiser. Some sports conduct two, some one, and others choose not to have a fundraisers





at all. All money raised in these fundraisers goes directly into the respective sport's account. According to Daviess County Public School Board Policy, any fundraiser must be approved by the school board and have a specific stated purpose for those monies raised prior to a fundraiser being conducted. The fundraising dollars — whether used for travel, equipment, uniforms, facility improvements, or basic day-to-day operations — go directly into the individual sport's account and are spent at the discretion of the coach. Since the fundraising dollars are put into each sport's account at Apollo, this money was reported as school expenditures as well.

Finally, I am obligated to bring to your attention the lateness of Apollo's Title IX meetings for the 2007-2008 school year. At Apollo, we take great pride in supporting male and female athletics equitably. During my 8 year tenure as athletic director, we have made great strides in equalizing funding and facilities. At Apollo, we are deeply committed to the core values of Title IX of equitable opportunity in athletic competition. In my opinion, Apollo High School borders on becoming a model school when it comes to supporting female athletics.

That being said, I do not wish for the individual(s) reviewing this report to get the false impression that Title IX is an unimportant issue at Apollo because the meetings were held so late in the year. Compliance to Title IX is a daily part of how I and Apollo Principal Tom Purcell make decisions. We are committed to the core values of Title IX and what it represents to making athletic opportunities equitable between the genders. As Title IX coordinator at Apollo, it is my duty to schedule our Title IX meetings, and I failed miserably this year. I can use having a new baby at home as an excuse. . . but that is all it is . . . a poor excuse.

Please know that this issue has been firmly addressed by Apollo Principal Tom Purcell, and it will not happen again.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (**do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads**). Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.

5) Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
