- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).

Since we already have a struggling volleybalk program and with athletic finances as they are, it is not in the best interest of our sports program to take on new activities at this time.

**RE**: Expenditure Comparisons

We have checked Form T-36 three times and we are getting the same total that was recorded on the original documentation sent to your office. If our numbers were correct, it would result in an expenditure or \$635 per male athlete. This would still not meet the guideline established by the KHSAA.

Regardless of the total calculation, the differential between the expenditures for male and female athletes is over \$100. This is the result of expenditures that occurred in the current renovation of the high school baseball field.

There has been no major renovation of that facility since it was built in 1984. The high school softball complex was completed in the late 1990's and that facility, even though it is located off campus at the old high school site, was far superior to our baseball/tennis complex. (If you remember, you toured the softball facility with Mr. Hilton and myself during your last visit to our school.) If you deduct that expenditure from the total expenditures for male athletes, you will see that the difference is less than \$100 per student athlete (\$454 vs. \$526).

Due to this fact we contend that there has not been a significant advantage given to boys over girls in the area of facility improvement and believe that Form T-41 has been completed correctly as submitted. When we report facility improvements next year, you will see major renovations to our gymnasium, which of course is the home of our basketball and volleyball programs. It just happened that the expenditures for the FY 2007 school year were mainly on a boy's facility.

I have enclosed minutes from the last two gender equity meetings which indicate that the school is well aware of the need to update all facilities, not just the relocation of the girl's softball complex. I have spoken to members of this committee and we agree that the wording found in the status report that states, "the long standing need to provide an adequate softball field," does not truly represent the facility in question. The major problem with this facility is not the condition it is in, but where it is located. Future plans do call for the construction of a new facility. Preliminary architectural drawings have already been rendered and cost estimates have been determined for the renovation of the football/track complex and the new construction of the softball/football complex and auxiliary gymnasium.

The Bell County School System has spent over \$500,000 during the past three years updating our athletic facilities and there is a concern about the future of any renovations during the next few years. Our system is facing a budget shortfall of almost a million dollars during the next two years, and the board has taken aggressive steps to cut over \$600,000 of expenditures next fiscal year. This includes the loss of approximately 25 certified and classified jobs this coming school year.

The superintendent and members of the board are aware and concerned with the issue of athletic facilities and programs provided by our school system. The committee has asked that they look at options on renewing the Three Year Athletic Facilities Plan that expires at the end of this fiscal year. As you can see they are in a tough place, but they are working on the budget this spring and hopefully some revenue can be found to continue the work they started three years ago. Until there is further action by the board, it is impossible to list any actions that may occur.
