The school's T-3 and T-60 forms indicate the athletic interests shown by females on the most recent survey are being addressed. The school needs to continue to monitor this situation. In the area of benefits, spending per athlete is barely within acceptable parameters. This spending should be monitored by school administrators as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee.</b></p>




