The school offers all sanctioned sports for girls at the varsity level. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is <u>not</u> within acceptable parameters primarily due to the large expenditure for a total re-conditioning of football uniforms. (See supplemental letter attached to T-35 and T-36 forms.) School officials should closely monitor spending over the next year to insure parity. The Corrective Action Plan seems to address needs appropriately.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
