D.		According to the 2007-2008 data, the school appears to be meeting the standards established in: Test 1 (Athletic participation is proportionate to enrollment) Test 2 (History and continuing practice of program expansion) Test 3 (Full and effective accommodation of interests and abilities)
E		Other Recommendation and Comments: On the T-3 form Casey County indicates that the students indicated in an interest in the sport of soccer. Looking at the student interest surveys indicates that there is a "strong" interest in starting the sport of soccer. Looking at the Corrective Action Plan there is no indication that the school has addressed this interest. It is highly recommended that the Gender Equity Committee meet and address this issue. Effort needs to be put forth to see if this interest is real and genuine. The Gender Equity

Committee needs to put this soccer issue in their Corrective Action Plan and document it in their next committee meeting minutes.

- When you look at the student population of Casey County you find that 51.2% of the student body is female. When you look at the student athletic participation at Casey County you find that 51.5% of the participation is female. Looking at the total spending a potential red flag has developed over the past three years.
 - a. 2005 2006 \$253.00 spent per-male athlete. \$151.00 spent per female athlete. This shows a difference of \$102.00 spent on male athletes.

b. 2006 – 2007 \$577.00 spent per-male athlete. \$427.00 spent per-female athlete.

This shows a difference of \$150.00 spent on male athletes.

c. 2007 - 2008 \$824.00 spent per-male athlete. \$540.00 spent per-female athlete. This shows a difference of \$284.00 spent per-male athletes.

It is "highly" recommended that the Gender Equity Committee get behind this and put forth a corrective action plan to bring this back into the \$100.00 difference in Boys/Girls spending in a football playing school. This action should be documented in the next meeting minutes of the Gender Equity Committee.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).

Plans to Address Interest: Youth Soccer just began in the fall in Casey Co. The plan is if there is continued interest by the time these young people reach the middle school to form a middle school soccer team. Then if the interest continues, (when the middle school players reach high school age), to form a JV soccer team at the high school level. Then follow the next season with a varsity team. This plan would allow the school district to seek out an area to build a soccer field. The football field at the high school would be unavailable for soccer. It is currently the only football field in the county and is used by the youth league, middle school, and high school. In addition, by putting in place a five year plan for soccer, it would allow the players to develop their skills, increase interest, and give them a chance to compete at the high school level, rather than starting a team now with no experience in the game of soccer and getting beaten every match. This would also establish a feeder program for the high school as well.

Casey County High School 2007-2008 Title IX Report Actual Expenditures **Explanations**

- * All sports are given the equal amount of \$100 to spend on their awards at the end of the season. Some sports spend less and some went slightly over their amount. But all are given the equal opportunity to spend the full amount of \$100 if they desire to do so. But the following spent below the amount: XC, Swim, girls' basketball, track, and volleyball.
- ** Baseball's facilities improvement amount of \$12,237 and **** football's facilities improvement amount of \$12,155 are tied together. Football and baseball are at the same field. In 2006 and 2007 the football field took a beating on the turf. The field is used by the youth league teams, middle and high school. Three of the home football games were played in the rain. Two from the middle school were played in wet weather as well. After the season we were left with no Bermuda grass between the hash lines and several spots bare throughout the field. During baseball season it made for rough fielding in center and left fields. Therefore, after baseball season we were out the cost to repair and replace dirt and Bermuda grass at the multi-sport complex. In addition we had to replace our scoreboard for the complex as well. The other scoreboard was 20 years old and not functioning properly. We were constantly working on it. Therefore, through some businesses and their donations we replaced it. Finally, the goal post pads were in rotten and in poor shape. I replaced those for safety reasons.
- ** Football required more expense to replace some football helmets and we reconditioned more for safety reasons. This was not planned in our budget and cost us more money.
- * Baseball required more travel expense due to a reduced number of home games due to the field conditions.
- * Girls Golf had less school expenditures in equipment and supplies because of low numbers as compared to the boys for uniform purchases. In addition, they were given the same chance to play in as many invitational tournaments but chose not to participate. This reduced their expenditures as well.
- **** The track boosters collected \$8,500.00 for each program to raise money to resurface the track with rubber.
- In school expenditures

The scoreboard, dirt fill, Bermuda grass, and football helmet situations really thru our spending off when comparing the boys and girls total spending and percentages. I hope that the necessity of the extra spending is justified and Casey County's record of equality remains in tact with our future planning.
