1. Summer Basketball Camps

Both the Boys and Girls Basketball teams were given the opportunity to go to summer Basketball camps.

The Girls chose to stay close to home and attend Northern Kentucky University's Team Camp. **Total Expenditures: \$400**

The Boys chose to attend Georgetown University's Team Camp, which required the boys to stay over night. **Total Expenditures: \$4770**

2. State Basketball Tournament

Both the boys and the girl's basketball coaches were given the opportunity to go to their respective state tournaments. The girl's coaches declined the offer and chose not to go. The boy's coaches, on the other hand, chose to go to the state tournament.

Total Expenditures for Boys BB State Tournament: \$722

3. Boys Golf Outing

\$3,496. was spent from the Boys' Basketball Golf Outing account for the school year of 2006-2007.

The Golf Outing for the school year of 2005-2006 was later in the year and the money (\$3,051.) was not turned in until after the beginning of the next fiscal school year. Therefore, on this year's Title IX report, this money appears as expenditures on the 2006-2007 finances, but actually reflects funds raised to pay for acquired expenses from the 2005-2006 school year.

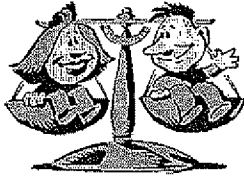
