Mr. Sorrell, please resubmit Forms T-3 and T-4 on the correct forms, which are available online from the KHSAA.

Note that the 2007-2008 Form T-3 asks for distinct plans to address the significant interests submitted by students on the survey. The note written on the old form that was submitted did identify the interest found in tennis and wrestling but did not include a plan to address the interest.

Regarding Form T-36, the calculations at the bottom of the page appear incorrect: expenditures for girls' sports should read \$77,918, or 44% of total expenditures. Boys' calculations are correct. Please make the change on T-36 in the school's permanent Title IX file.

What also needs to be brought to your attention is a differential in the amount spent per male athlete versus each female athlete. Dollars spent for individual male athletes has exceeded that for females more than \$100 an athlete consistently. The KHSAA guideline for schools that have football teams uses \$100 as a threshold for expenditures per male athlete to allow for the greater expense of football programs. This pattern of overexpenditure for male athletes needs to be investigated to explain the difference.

Due to the fact that accurate data and explanations are difficult to receive from Fleming County High School, it is incumbent upon the Principal to provide this information with an assurance that it is accurate. In addition to resubmitting Forms T-3 and T-4, resubmit Form T-60 with corrective action planned for the advantages recorded on Form T-41. What was resubmitted on Form T-60 was nothing more than a copy of the original Form T-60 submitted. There must be a connection between items identified on Form T-41 and the submissions on Form T-60. Include on the revised Form T-60 the plan to investigate the pattern of expenditure differential per male and female athlete over the past three years.

Your cooperation in gathering and submitting the requested data will be appreciated.
