- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.

Ms. Martha Mullins,

I would like to apologize for our Gender Equity Committee's non-compliance with the 2006-07 Corrective Action Plan, which required committee meetings in October, January, and April of 2007-08. As a new Athletic Director under a new Principal, with but two returning members of the committee this year I was unaware of the current corrective action plan until February when we began our Title IX Self Audit.
