E		Other Recommendation and Comments: Please submit to the KHSAA the minutes of your Gender Equity Committee for the 2008-2009 school year with your annual report. Your school reported a large expenditure for awards for football and no expenditures for any other sport. Your Gender Equity Committee should review your school's award policies to ensure that there is equity. The expenditures reported for boys and girls this year appear to show an inequity in benefits provided. Your spending for male participants was 64% of your athletic budget; however, you actually had more female participants. You spent \$661 per male participant and \$361 per female participant. Your school did not submit documentation that would explain this wide disparity in spending. Your Gender Equity Committee should closely monitor athletic expenditures to ensure that this pattern in spending does not continue.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

- 1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
- 2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8. **Note:** The totals in Row 4 for girls and in Row 8 for boys must be the same as the totals in Form T-1, Column 3, Rows 1 and 2 respectively.
