The purpose of this letter is to clarify and explain Lafayette High School's Title 9 report. There are several points that we would like to make note off. Lafayette High School is in compliance with Title 9 as mandated by the KHSAA. As the report is reviewed we would like to note:

- This year Lafayette did not field a Junior Varsity Girls Soccer team. This was one of the factors that lead to Lafayette's change in leadership in that sport. Lafayette intends on adding Junior Varsity Girls Soccer next year.
