Although no deficiencies were designated by the most recent school visit, the following "areas of concern" listed in this report need to be addressed.

- (EQUIPMENT and SUPPLIES)—On or before <u>February 15, 2008,</u> the school is to submit to KHSAA a written uniform review/replacement plan. This plan is to be signed by the members of the Gender Equity Review Committee, principal, district Title IX coordinator, and athletic director and distributed to all Head Coaches. This document should also be a part of the school's April 15, 2008 Corrective Action Plan submitted to KHSAA.
- (COACHING)—On or before <u>February 15, 2008</u>, the school is to submit to KHSAA a written status report on its attempt to add a coaching stipend for a freshman volleyball coach. This document should also be a part of the school's April 15, 2008 Corrective Action Plan submitted to KHSAA.
- (LOCKER ROOMS, PRACTICE and COMPETITIVE FACILITIES)—On or before <u>February 15, 2008</u>, the school is to submit to KHSAA a written plan for addressing the drainage problem and the "restroom holding tank problem" at the softball field. The plan should indicate that these issues are being resolved in a timely manner. This plan is to be signed by the principal, athletic director, and district Title IX coordinator. It should also be a part of the school's April 15, 2008 Corrective Action Plan submitted to KHSAA.
- (SUPPORT SERVICES)—On or before <u>February 15, 2008</u>, the school is to submit to KHSAA a written booster club agreement and/or guidelines for administrative oversight of booster spending. These guidelines should include the person(s)/position(s) responsible for this monitoring and give definitions of their roles as well as a step by step description of the purchase process. This document should also be a part of the school's April 15, 2008 Corrective Action Plan submitted to KHSAA.

8. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to reoccurring deficiencies

No deficiencies were designated by the original school visit or the more recent visit. Therefore, the school currently has no re-occurring deficiencies.

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Equipment and Supplies

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for inventorying equipment, supplies, and uniforms.

Policy Statement

All equipment items and supplies purchased for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

- 1. All athletic equipment, supplies and uniforms shall be inventoried on the district's athletic inventory sheet and submitted to the athletics director approximately four weeks at the conclusion of each sports season.
- 2. Coaches will maintain an accurate record of equipment/supplies purchased by booster clubs and include the items in the annual inventory report.
- 3. Athletic uniforms for each sport will be purchased by title ix funds provided by the school district each year. Each team will be on a three year rotation for the purchase of new uniforms. Monies allotted for each sport's uniform will be determined on cost and the individual need of each sport. Refer to the Uniform rotation form for allotted amounts.
- 4. Replacement of uniforms prior to the teams turn in the three year rotation will be based on need. Any money allocated for the replacement of uniforms prior to the three year rotation turn will be deducted from the team's budget for equipment and supplies for that given season. The entire set(s) of uniforms will not be replaced unless lost due to fire, water damage, or stolen.
- 5. The quality and quantity of uniforms purchased for LaRue County High School athletic teams will be the same.
- 6. All uniform and equipment purchases must be approved by the athletics director and principal. Purchase Order numbers will be issued by the athletics director. The athletics director and individual coach will order all uniforms and major equipment purchases with approval of the principal.
- 7. Equipment purchases for like sports (as listed above in #3) shall be on an equal basis. In the event equipment is shared (i.e. indoor batting cage) the monies shall be divided equally between the two sports. Each sport will have the same equal access to all equipment purchased for the use of both male and female sports.

Scheduling of Games and Practice Times

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for scheduling of games and practice times.

Policy Statement

All games and practice times for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

- 1. Head coaches will be responsible for scheduling all games, scrimmages, practice times, and weight lifting.
- 2. All scheduling of games, scrimmages, practice times and weight lifting must be approved by the athletics director.
- 3. Facilities practice times and weight lifting schedules will be scheduled with the athletics director's calendar of events for those facilities. Scott Kirkpatrick will be the contact person for scheduling the weight room.
- 4. Male and female identical or similar sports that share facilities on an equitable basis will rotate in scheduling practice sessions week to week. For example, if the girls' basketball team practices in the gym the first week of practice, then they will practice late the next week allowing the boys' team to practice early the following week. This pattern will continue throughout the season.
- 5. In the event of the cancellation of school to the weather (snow, flood) or other reasons, teams will rotate equitably on a day-to-day basis as to who practices early and late. This will be predetermined prior to the start of the athletic season by a coin toss.
- 6. Basketball head coaches shall insure that 40% of the girls' basketball games are during prime date (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday).
- 7. In the event of a girl/boy varsity team double header basketball game, head coaches must insure that girls' varsity team play in the second game of the night at least half of the scheduled contests. This rotation should be conducted every other contest.
- 8. All volleyball, football, basketball, baseball, and softball games shall be secured via KHSAA contract forms with KHSAA competitors so there is a balance in the number of home and away games each season.
- 9. All athletic facilities usage schedules (practices, scrimmages, and games), including the gymnasium, courts, and athletic fields shall be posted in the Assistant Principal's office.

Travel and Per Diem

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the travel and per diem of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All athletic travel and per diem of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The athletics department will not provide monies for the purchase of meals during the regular season.
- 2. In the event that a team or individual makes the state tournament in their sport, the athletics department will purchase **ONE** meal during the teams or individuals stay at the state contest. Meal money allocated for any team is \$350.00. Individual players for individual sports (golf, tennis, cross country, swim) will receive an allocation of \$15.00 each.
- 3. Booster clubs that purchase meals for athletes must equitably allocate the same amount of money for each meal for boys and girls. Money amounts for each meal must be the same for girls and boys similar sports (i.e. basketball, softball, etc.)
- 4. Booster clubs that purchase hotel rooms for athletes must equitably allocate the same amount of money for each room for boys and girls. Money amounts for each room must be the same for girls and boys similar sports (i.e. basketball, softball, etc.)
- 5. The athletics department will provide equitably all transportation for athletic events for male and female sports. All buses will be comparable for both male and female teams.
- 6. Male and female sports shall be given equitable travel opportunities for regular season tournaments, post season tournaments, out-of-region and out-of-state events. Each female and male athletic team will be given the opportunity of participating in one out-of-state contest each year. ALL out-of-state events must be approved by the board of education.
- 7. Out-of-state trips must have the same equitable location for each team and/or program. For example, if the boys' baseball team wants to play in Florida, the girls' softball team must be given the same opportunity to play in Florida as well.
- 8. The head coach shall submit travel requests for bus transportation to the Athletics Director prior to the start of the competition season. Any additional requests must be made ten days in advance before transportation is required.
- 9. Student athletes shall ride the athletic bus to any scheduled event.
- 10. Student athletes that do not ride the bus will not be allowed to participate in the scheduled event for that evening. All student athletes traveling by bus to school sponsored activities **MUST** return to the school on the same bus unless the parent or legal guardian personally addresses the coach or other supervising school authority and takes custody of their child and signs them out with the coach.
- 11. Student athletes may not be released to ride with any person other than their own parent or legal guardian. (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- 12. Student athletes with extenuating circumstances may request approval for another means of transportation, by the principal or athletics director.

Coaches

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the hiring procedures, equal staffing, and education opportunities of the coaches of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All athletic coaches of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The school district's board of education shall maintain an equitable pay scale for all coaches of male and female teams. A copy of the pay scale shall be placed in the permanent Title IX File.
- 2. The athletic department shall seek qualified adult women for coaching positions as they become available. The SBDM and Board of Education shall post coaching positions of female sports that specifically requests that female applicants are desired for the position. The athletics director shall post coaching positions on the KHSAA web site to allow a state wide posting of the position to reach more female qualified applicants. The athletics director shall seek out former female student athletes that are now educators and encourage them to apply for coaching positions at their alma mater.
- 3. The number of assistant coaches shall be equal for like teams if the number of participants is parallel for both the male team and female team.
- 4. The SBDM shall make every endeavor to hire coaches with similar levels of competence and experience for male and female teams.
- 5. Coaches of female and male teams shall have the same equitable opportunities to attend various clinics, in-services, conferences, and seminars.
- 6. The Principal, SBDM, and Athletics director shall maintain, when possible, a balance of on-campus/off-campus coaches for teams of both genders.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the assignment of locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities for teams of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1.Banners: Every sport offered at LaRue County High School shall have an achievement banner hanging on the High School gymnasium back wall. All banners will be displayed on student section end of the gym. District and Regional championships and runners-up will be recognized by title and year under the sports heading. Individual sports will list regional winners, runners-up, and state qualifiers. Boys' and girls' teams that qualify for the state basketball Sweet Sixteen will have a separate banner. A team that wins a state championship will receive a larger banner in the shape of Kentucky with the championship year and a listing of all players, managers, and coaches. Individual state champions will be recognized with a separate banner from the team banner and list their name, event, and year of the championship (i.e. track and field).
- 2. Awards & Trophies: All trophy cases in the gym shall display all female and male KHSAA district, regional, and state winners and runners-up for all sports. Trophy cases located inside the school building will display all other trophies of all sports.
- 3.All locker rooms shall be assigned by the athletics director. All locker rooms will be provided with the same amentias (carpet, rest rooms, showers, lockable lockers and dry erase boards).

Hawks Nest (located behind baseball field): baseball, cross country, soccer softball, track, and wrestling

Boys' PE locker room: cross country, track, baseball

Girls' PE locker room: cross country, track, softball, volleyball

Boys Basketball locker room: as needed

Girls Basketball locker room: volleyball

Football Field House: Football (in season), track (in season); wrestling (in-season)

Country Club locker rooms: girls' and boys' golf

Medical/Training Facilities and Services

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for medical/training facilities and services for student athletes.

Policy Statement

All medical/training facilities and services shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. All female and male student athletes have equitable access to the school's Athletic Trainer provided by HMH. The district has a certified athletic trainer (currently Eric Oliver, HMH). Coaches shall be responsible for taping student athletes when certified trainer is not available.
- 2. All like sports shall have the same number of student managers for both the female and male sports.
- 3. Female athletes shall be given the same amount of time and schedule to access the weight room in and out of season. The weight room shall have appropriate weights and universal machines for female athletes.
- 4. The weight room shall contain appropriate instructional weight lifting demonstration posters for both female and male athletes and decorated in a manner suitable for both sexes.
- 5. The schedule for the use of the weight room shall be posted on the field house bulletin board. Scheduled use of the weight room shall take place through the weight room coordinator (currently Scotty Kirkpatrick). Female sports will be given equitable scheduled times to use the facility.

Publicity

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for publicity for all student athletes.

Policy Statement

All publicity for all athletics programs shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The LCHS cheerleading squad shall be assigned to perform at all home boys and girls basketball and football games. Cheerleaders will be assigned to participate at all away contest for football, half of all away contests for boys' and girls' basketball games. All cheerleaders will cheer at all district away games. Cheerleaders will cheer ALL girls' and boys' post season contests for basketball and football.
- The band will be assigned to play at least six home boys' basketball and girls' basketball games and all home football games.
- 3. Booster clubs or LCHS will publish seasonal media guides that honor all athletic teams, male and female, for that season (i.e. fall sports would include: boys' and girls' golf and cross country, volleyball, and football teams).
- 4. Local media (radio & newspapers) will be contacted and given schedules of all athletic teams and encouraged to give equitable coverage to both male and female sports.
- 5. All photographs must include team photos of both male and female teams of the same and different sports.
- 6. All pep rallies will support teams of both genders.
- 7. Student Awards: Trophies and awards shall be provided and purchased by the LCHS athletics department. Each sport (male and female) will be allocated \$100.00 per sport to purchase trophies and/or plaques for student athletes. The awards serve as a means of stimulation and motivation for our student athletes.
- Each LCHS sports team (male and female) shall present awards at the end of their respective seasons.
- Criteria established for lettering shall be determined by each head coach of their program.
- 10. Certificates of participation shall be presented to all participants of each sport.
- 11. Special Awards such as MVP, MIP, etc. shall be at the discretion of the head coach.
- 12. Academic Awards for all male and female sports are provided by the local newspaper, The Herald News.
- 13. Only athletes who finish the season or who would have finished the season except for illness or injury shall be eligible for athletic awards.
- 14. All banquets for all female and male sports shall be held in the LARUE COUNTY school district.
- 15. Like sports (i.e boys' and girls' golf) shall have their awards banquet at the same time.
- 16. Athletics Director shall make the community and school district aware of the athletics department's efforts and accomplishments to achieve the intent and spirit of Title IX through reports to the SBDM, Board of Education, and local media.

Policy Statement

All support services shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. All coaches shall be assigned an office with office space for various records and assignments including the LCHS Title IX Manual.
- All like and similar sports (i.e. girls' and boys' track, cross country, soccer, tennis, baseball and softball shall structure joint-fund raising activities that will equally benefit both the male and female teams.
- 3. The LCHS principal and athletics director shall maintain written agreements will all booster clubs that clearly define the role of the booster's club and its relationship to the school and the school's administration.
- Inform booster's clubs that their efforts and expenditures can cause the school to be non-Title IX compliant.
- 5. The principal and athletics director shall insure appropriate administrative oversight of booster club's activities and insure that there are written procedures for the athletic director/principal/school board approval for fund raising and expenditures that benefit all athletic teams.
- The principal and athletics director shall calculate and monitor the amount of money spent by booster clubs per male athlete as compared with the amount of money spent per female athlete.
- 7. The LCHS principal and athletics director shall meet with the boosters clubs at the beginning of each school year to establish accounting, fund raising, expenditure procedures and guidelines and Title IX rules. The athletics director shall meet with boosters clubs as needed with concerns or to assist the club in determining their future course.
- 8. LCHS shall establish and maintain one booster club for each like sport such as girls and boys basketball. Volleyball and football booster clubs will stand alone but will held to the same standards as the other boosters clubs. The following boosters clubs are established at LCHS:

7. KHSAA RECOMMENDED ACTION IN RELATION TO NEW DEFICIENCIES

COACHING

In regards to adding a freshman volleyball coach at LCHS: Over the last year the LCHS volleyball program has added an additional coach to assist the freshman volleyball team. Currently, the district has 2 paid stipends: head coach and assistant coach. This past year the freshman volleyball coach was paid a portion of the assistant coach stipend to assist the volleyball program. This past year a majority of the freshman games were scheduled on the same day of the jv and varsity matches. The only time a freshman coach was needed alone was in the case of tournaments where the varsity and jv teams were in action at another school while the freshman had a tournament at another location. The volleyball program consistently has 25-28 females involved in the program. The need for a freshman coach will be determined on a year to year basis. If the numbers suffice for a freshman coach at the beginning of the year then a freshman coach will be put in place.

LOCKER ROOM, PRACTICE and COMPETITIVE FACILITIES

The district is making plans to run a sewer line from the softball holding tank to the main sewer line located near the bus garage. The district has contacted Gary Clifford to facilitate this operation and conclude by Spring, 2008.

 - (SUPPORT SERVICES)—On or before <u>February 15, 2008</u>, the school is to submit to KHSAA a written booster club agreement and/or guidelines for administrative oversight of booster spending. These guidelines should include the person(s)/position(s) responsible for this monitoring and give definitions of their roles as well as a step by step description of the purchase process. This document should also be a part of the school's April 15, 2008 Corrective Action Plan submitted to KHSAA.
 - 8. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to reoccurring deficiencies

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for inventorying equipment, supplies, and uniforms.

Policy Statement

All equipment items and supplies purchased for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

- 1. All athletic equipment, supplies and uniforms shall be inventoried on the district's athletic inventory sheet and submitted to the athletics director approximately four weeks at the conclusion of each sports season.
- 2. Coaches will maintain an accurate record of equipment/supplies purchased by booster clubs and include the items in the annual inventory report.
- 3. Athletic uniforms for each sport will be purchased by title ix funds provided by the school district each year. Each team will be on a three year rotation for the purchase of new uniforms. Monies allotted for each sport's uniform will be determined on cost and the individual need of each sport. Refer to the Uniform rotation form for allotted amounts.
- 4. Replacement of uniforms prior to the teams turn in the three year rotation will be based on need. Any money allocated for the replacement of uniforms prior to the three year rotation turn will be deducted from the team's budget for equipment and supplies for that given season. The entire set(s) of uniforms will not be replaced unless lost due to fire, water damage, or stolen.
- 5. The quality and quantity of uniforms purchased for LaRue County High School athletic teams will be the same.
- 6. All uniform and equipment purchases must be approved by the athletics director and principal. Purchase Order numbers will be issued by the athletics director. The athletics director and individual coach will order all uniforms and major equipment purchases with approval of the principal.
- 7. Equipment purchases for like sports (as listed above in #3) shall be on an equal basis. In the event equipment is shared (i.e. indoor batting cage) the monies shall be divided equally between the two sports. Each sport will have the same equal access to all equipment purchased for the use of both male and female sports.

Scheduling of Games and Practice Times

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for scheduling of games and practice times.

Policy Statement

All games and practice times for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

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practice times, and weight lifting. All scheduling of games, scrimmages, practice times and weight lifting must
he meaning by the athletics director

- be approved by the athletics director. 3. Facilities practice times and weight lifting schedules will be scheduled with the athletics director's calendar of events for those facilities. Scott Kirkpatrick will be the contact person for scheduling the weight room.
- 4. Male and female identical or similar sports that share facilities on an equitable basis will rotate in scheduling practice sessions week to week. For example, if the girls' basketball team practices in the gym the first week of practice, then they will practice late the next week allowing the boys' team to practice early the following week. This pattern will continue throughout the season.
- 5. In the event of the cancellation of school to the weather (snow, flood) or other reasons, teams will rotate equitably on a day-to-day basis as to who practices early and late. This will be predetermined prior to the start of the athletic season by a coin toss.
- 6. Basketball head coaches shall insure that 40% of the girls' basketball games are during prime date (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday).
- 7. In the event of a girl/boy varsity team double header basketball game, head coaches must insure that girls' varsity team play in the second game of the night at least half of the scheduled contests. This rotation should be conducted every other contest.
- 8. All volleyball, football, basketball, baseball, and softball games shall be secured via KHSAA contract forms with KHSAA competitors so there is a balance in the number of home and away games each season.
- 9. All athletic facilities usage schedules (practices, scrimmages, and games), including the gymnasium, courts, and athletic fields shall be posted in the Assistant Principal's office.

Policy Statement

All athletic travel and per diem of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The athletics department will not provide monies for the purchase of meals during the regular season.
- 2. In the event that a team or individual makes the state tournament in their sport, the athletics department will purchase ONE meal during the teams or individuals stay at the state contest. Meal money allocated for any team is \$350.00. Individual players for individual sports (golf, tennis, cross country, swim) will receive an allocation of \$15.00 each.
- Booster clubs that purchase meals for athletes must equitably allocate the same amount of money for each meal for boys and girls. Money amounts for each meal must be the same for girls and boys similar sports (i.e. basketball, softball, etc.)
- 4. Booster clubs that purchase hotel rooms for athletes must equitably allocate the same amount of money for each room for boys and girls. Money amounts for each room must be the same for girls and boys similar sports (i.e. basketball, softball, etc.)
- 5. The athletics department will provide equitably all transportation for athletic events for male and female sports. All buses will be comparable for both male and female teams.
- 6. Male and female sports shall be given equitable travel opportunities for regular season tournaments, post season tournaments, out-of-region and out-of-state events. Each female and male athletic team will be given the opportunity of participating in one out-of-state contest each year. ALL out-of-state events must be approved by the board of education.
- 7. Out-of-state trips must have the same equitable location for each team and/or program. For example, if the boys' baseball team wants to play in Florida, the girls' softball team must be given the same opportunity to play in Florida as well.
- 8. The head coach shall submit travel requests for bus transportation to the Athletics Director prior to the start of the competition season. Any additional requests must be made ten days in advance before transportation is required.
- 9. Student athletes shall ride the athletic bus to any scheduled event.
- 10. Student athletes that do not ride the bus will not be allowed to participate in the scheduled event for that evening. All student athletes traveling by bus to school sponsored activities MUST return to the school on the same bus unless the parent or legal guardian personally addresses the coach or other supervising school authority and takes custody of their child and signs them out with the coach.
- 11. Student athletes may not be released to ride with any person other than their own parent or legal guardian. (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- 12. Student athletes with extenuating circumstances may request approval for another means of transportation, by the principal or athletics director.

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the hiring procedures, equal staffing, and education opportunities of the coaches of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All athletic coaches of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The school district's board of education shall maintain an equitable pay scale for all coaches of male and female teams. A copy of the pay scale shall be placed in the permanent Title IX File.
- 2. The athletic department shall seek qualified adult women for coaching positions as they become available. The SBDM and Board of Education shall post coaching positions of female sports that specifically requests that female applicants are desired for the position. The athletics director shall post coaching positions on the KHSAA web site to allow a state wide posting of the position to reach more female qualified applicants. The athletics director shall seek out former female student athletes that are now educators and encourage them to apply for coaching positions at their alma mater.
- 3. The number of assistant coaches shall be equal for like teams if the number of participants is parallel for both the male team and female team.
- 4. The SBDM shall make every endeavor to hire coaches with similar levels of competence and experience for male and female teams.
- 5. Coaches of female and male teams shall have the same equitable opportunities to attend various clinics, in-services, conferences, and seminars.
- 6. The Principal, SBDM, and Athletics director shall maintain, when possible, a balance of on-campus/off-campus coaches for teams of both genders.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities

Policy

The LaRue County High School Athletics Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the assignment of locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities for teams of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities of student athletes shall be governed

- 1.Banners: Every sport offered at LaRue County High School shall have an achievement banner hanging on the High School gymnasium back wall. All banners will be displayed on student section end of the gym. District and Regional championships and runners-up will be recognized by title and year under the sports heading. Individual sports will list regional winners, runners-up, and state qualifiers. Boys' and girls' teams that qualify for the state basketball Sweet Sixteen will have a separate banner. A team that wins a state championship will receive a larger banner in the shape of Kentucky with the championship year and a listing of all players, managers, and coaches. Individual state champions will be recognized with a separate banner from the team banner and list their name, event, and year of the championship (i.e. track and field).
- 2. Awards & Trophies: All trophy cases in the gym shall display all female and male KHSAA district, regional, and state winners and runners-up for all sports. Trophy cases located inside the school building will display all other trophies of all sports.
- 3.All locker rooms shall be assigned by the athletics director. All locker rooms will be provided with the same amentias (carpet, rest rooms, showers, lockable lockers and dry erase boards).

 - 5. The schedule for the use of the weight room shall be posted on the field house bulletin board. Scheduled use of the weight room shall take place through the weight room coordinator (currently Scotty Kirkpatrick). Female sports will be given equitable scheduled times to use the facility.

All publicity for all athletics programs shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 6. All pep railies will support teams of both genders.
- 7. Student Awards: Trophies and awards shall be provided and purchased by the LCHS athletics department. Each sport (male and female) will be allocated \$100.00 per sport to purchase trophies and/or plaques for student athletes. The awards serve as a means of stimulation and motivation for our student athletes.
- 8. Each LCHS sports team (male and female) shall present awards at the end of their respective seasons.
- 9. Criteria established for lettering shall be determined by each head coach of their program.
- 10. Certificates of participation shall be presented to all participants of each sport.
- 11. Special Awards such as MVP, MIP, etc. shall be at the discretion of the head coach.
- 12. Academic Awards for all male and female sports are provided by the local newspaper, The Herald News.
- 13. Only athletes who finish the season or who would have finished the season except for illness or injury shall be eligible for athletic awards.
- 14. All banquets for all female and male sports shall be held in the LARUE COUNTY school district.
- 15. Like sports (i.e boys' and girls' golf) shall have their awards banquet at the same time.
- 16. Athletics Director shall make the community and school district aware of the athletics department's efforts and accomplishments to achieve the intent and spirit of Title IX through reports to the SBDM, Board of Education, and local media.

7. KHSAA RECOMMENDED ACTION IN RELATION TO NEW DEFICIENCIES

COACHING

In regards to adding a freshman volleyball coach at LCHS: Over the last year the LCHS volleyball program has added an additional coach to assist the freshman volleyball team. Currently, the district has 2 paid stipends: head coach and assistant coach. This past year the freshman volleyball coach was paid a portion of the assistant coach stipend to assist the volleyball program. This past year a majority of the freshman games were scheduled on the same day of the jv and varsity matches. The only time a freshman coach was needed alone was in the case of tournaments where the varsity and jv teams were in action at another school while the freshman had a tournament at another location. The volleyball program consistently has 25-28 females involved in the program. The need for a freshman coach will be determined on a year to year basis. If the numbers suffice for a freshman coach at the beginning of the year then a freshman coach will be put in place.

LOCKER ROOM, PRACTICE and COMPETITIVE FACILITIES

The district is making plans to run a sewer line from the softball holding tank to the main sewer line located near the bus garage. The district has contacted Gary Clifford to facilitate this operation and conclude by Spring, 2008.
