This year the disparity of expenditures reported for males and females could indicate an inequity in benefits. This past year you spent \$469.00 more per male participant than female participant. You have addressed the problem of booster spending on your corrective action plan; however, your Gender Equity Review Committee should closely monitor expenditures next year to ensure that spending is equitable.
