



Corrective Action Plan

MEADE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL TITLE IX CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN APRIL 15, 2008

EACH OF THE FOUR ITEMS BELOW HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS A RESULT OF THE RE-VISIT ON DECEMBER 17, 2007. THE GENDER EQUITY COMMITTEE, ALONG WITH THE SCHOOL OFFICIALS, HAS ADDRESSED THESE AND DECIDED TO PRESENT THEM AS ITS CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN FOR 2007-2008.

ITEM #1: The school was asked to submit to the KHSAA a written uniform review/replacement plan "which shows an equity of benefits in relation to future purchases."

ITEM #1 STRATEGY: The AD presented a Uniform Rotation Plan to the Principal for approval. The plan became effective January 1, 2007. It is attached to this document.

OK ITEM #2: The school was asked to submit to the KHSAA a "written expansion of its current guidelines for provision of per diem to include regular season trips as well as post season."

ITEM #2 STRATEGY: The previous policy had been to use funds from the MCHS Athletic Account to provide meals and lodging for teams/individuals involved in state competitions during the post season. For the regular season, the teams had used a variety of other sources for these funds (boosters, internal accounts, parents, individual pay, etc). In the future, there will be a cap placed on these amounts for both the regular and post season. Meals will be limited to no more than \$10.00 per athlete and lodging will be limited to room rates of no more than \$100.00 per night based on 4 athletes per room. Exceptions to this must receive prior approval of the Principal or AD.

proximity of locker rooms for each team. The Football, Soccer (B&G), and Basketball (B&G) teams will share the new weight room at MCHS. The JRA facility will be shared by the Volleyball, Wrestling, Baseball, Swim (B&G), Track (B&G), and Cross County (B&G) programs. At this time, Golf and Tennis have declined the use of either facility. The size of each facility will allow coaches to schedule the specific dates and times for use of each facility independent of others' schedules and with few, if any, conflicts. The AD will meet with all coaches to discuss this plan and all expectations.
