The Gender Equity Committee needs to address the issues of having at least three committee meetings during the school year. Looking at the report indicates that you only had two meetings during the past year as the

- third date listed (June 1, 2008) is after the school year. It is highly recommended that this committee meet once during each of the sports seasons (Fall Winter Spring. Many schools meet more that three times a year.
- The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at the disparity in some sports receiving awards and others not receiving awards.
- The Gender Equity Committee needs to address the disparity in spending in boys baseball and girls softball. The boys team spent \$3,679.00 more in equipment and supplies, \$\$1,862.00 more in travel and \$349.00 more in awards. According to the report the Girls Softball team received no awards.
- Minutes of the next Gender Equity Committee should reflect the action taken in regard to each situation listed above.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
