- The Gender Equity Committee needs to address the disparity in sports offerings at Pineville. Currently the school offers four girls sports compared to six boys sports. Volleyball appears to be in the planning stage and the Gender Equity Committee needs to really get behind this and let it become a reality instead of a plan. Girls Cross Country and Girls Golf are also areas that show some interest and if really pushed in physical education classes they too may become a reality.
- Minutes of the next Gender Equity Committee should reflect the action taken in regard to each situation listed above.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
